TJ Watt landed second place and it was close between them. TJ constantly forced pressure on quarterbacks and had the most forced fumbles on the season.

Trey Hendrickson landed the most sacks this season with 17.5 which is 4 more than anyone else. Hendrickson was the only bright spark on the Bengals defence.

Safety Kyle Hamilton was outstanding all year leading the Ravens defence. He seemed to be everywhere on the field.

Wrapping up the top 5 is Zach Baun who has been a tackling machine with 93 solo tackles with 5 forced fumbles.

Robinson at the end of the season was amazing to watch for the Dolphins. 6 sacks on the season but it was how he affected the pocket, constantly creating pressures and opportunities.
